WV-VA WATER QUALITY MONITORING PROGRAM

TU and its West Virginia and Virginia Councils are partnering with the West Virginia Rivers Coalition (WV Rivers) to train volunteers to monitor coldwater resources that have the potential to be impacted by shale gas-related development.

The goals of this workshop are twofold. First, to educate volunteers about the potential impacts to fish and wildlife resources in the shale gas region of West Virginia and Virginia and second train volunteers to effectively monitor the water quality in these areas. TU and WV Rivers will work with these trained volunteers to conduct water quality monitoring in priority watersheds that have been identified by WV Rivers and TU's science team as critical for protecting ecologically significant lands and waters.
